- **International Conservation Trips:** Once a year we head off to some remote corner of the world to help with wildlife conservation! Typically run in Costa Rica (a safe, friendly, and welcoming country) we might help save sea turtles, or help in a wildlife rehabilitation center. Whatever we do, you KNOW it will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience! Affordable, fun, safe, and you know we'll work their behinds off the whole time!! Minimum group size is 12 + 2 chaperones.
- **Eagle Scout Mentoring (FREE***):** Since 1999 I have consulted for over 70 eagle scout projects which somehow dovetail with my numerous wildlife studies across Long Island. Our projects benefit local wildlife as well as the local communities. Projects include Tracking Wildlife, Erosion Controls on hiking trails, Mapping Parks/Habitats, and build Bird Feeding Stations, Osprey Nests, Owl Boxes, Snake Hibernaculi, and River Otter Dens!
